

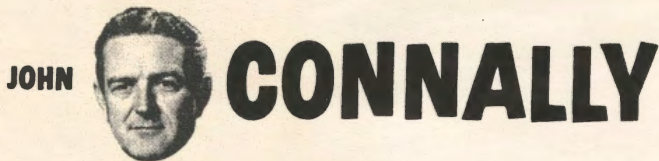

Who He Is . . . What He Has Done

One of the most distinguished young Texans of our time, John Connally is a native son who has achieved national prominence for his accomplishments in private and public life.

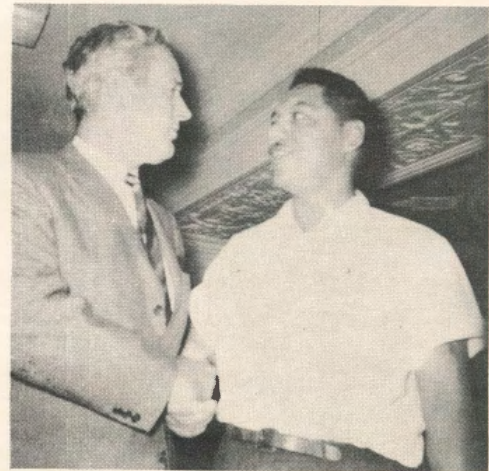
- Born on a farm near Floresville in 1917, one of seven children of J. B. and Lela Wright Connally, well-known South Texas pioneers.
- Attended public schools in Floresville and San Antonio.
- Worked way through University of Texas, earned law degree and was president of student body.
- Volunteered for active duty with Navy before Pearl Harbor.
- Won heroic combat decorations, including Bronze Star, Legion of Merit.
- Maintained successful private practice of law in Austin.
- Successful independent businessman, organizer and president of KVET radio station in Austin.
- Widely-respected attorney-executive for the late Sid Richardson and Perry R. Bass, independent oil operators.
- Operates South Texas ranch, along with two brothers.
- Served as administrative assistant in Congress to now Vice-President Lyndon B. Johnson.
- Dedicated leader in Democratic party, was vice chairman of Texas delegation to National Democratic Convention in 1956.
- Served as Secretary of the Navy of the United States, appointed by President John F. Kennedy.

In August 1939, he was employed as secretary to Congressman Lyndon Johnson, resigning in February 1941. Also served as Administrative Assistant to Senator Johnson for eight months between January and October 1949.

In December 1960 he was appointed Secretary of the Navy by President John F. Kennedy, serving in the position until December 1961.

In 1961 John Connally was the sixth to receive The University of Texas Ex-Students Association Distinguished Alumnus Award. The last preceding recipient of this recognition was the late Sam Rayburn. Other recipients were: Ramon Beteta, distinguished Mexican diplomat and journalist; Robert B. Anderson, Secretary of the Treasury; Dr. Walter Prescott Webb, distinguished historian and member of University faculty since 1918; Dr. Logan Wilson, Chancellor of University and now President of American Council of Education.

In the field of public service he is a Director of Boys, Incorporated, of America, a charitable organization fighting juvenile delinquency among boys. He is honorary Chairman of the Gonzales Warm Springs Foundation and Director of the Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show.
