

BILLS INTRODUCED (CONTD)

- H. B. 97 By Sewell. A mend. Sec. 15 of H.B. 611, Chap. 562, p. 914, General Laws of the State of Texas, Acts, Reg. Sess. 47th Legis., 1941, as amended, providing for examinations by licensed optometrists as well as ophthalmologists or physicians skilled in the treatment of diseases of the eye for the purpose of establishing blindness for applicants and/or recipients of Aid to the Needy Blind. Ref. to Comm. on State Affairs.
- H. B. 98 By Swindell and Norton. An Act authorizing the governing boards of State supported institutions of higher learning to procure insurance on any or all structures and bldgs. and the contents thereof under their management and control against all or any of the risks of fire, lightning, wind-storms, etc. Ref. to Comm. on Education.
- H. B. 99 By Morrison. An Act amend. Sec. 10, 11, 12 and 13 of Art. 6008, Texas Civil Statutes Annotated (Vernon, 1949) providing that the R.R. Comm. of Texas shall prorate and regulate daily production of natural gas to prevent waste and adjust correlative rights (except casinghead gas). Ref. to Comm. on Oil, Gas & Mining.
- H. B. 100 By Murphy. Authorizing and directing the State Highway Department to construct and maintain motor vehicle parking areas and ramps or ways for launching motor boats and hauling the same from the water; directing cooperation with the Game, Fish and Oyster Comm.; authorizing and directing the use of certain funds. Ref. to Comm. on Highways & Roads.
- H. B. 101 By Ross, Berlin and Nimitz. An Act validating the creation, etc., of port dists. and navigation dists. operating public ports; ratifying taxes assessed and levied by or on behalf of such; providing such dists are governmental agencies, etc. Ref. to Comm. on Judiciary. Same as S. B. 13.
- H. B. 102. By Zivley. An Act to make it unlawful to practice chiroprody without a valid license duly registered in the Dist. Clerk's Office; providing for the keeping of a "Chiroprody Register" by every Dist. Clerk; defining those regarded as practicing chiroprody; providing for examination by the Board of Chiroprody Examiners of applicants for license to practice chiroprody in Texas. Ref. to Comm. on Public Health.
- H. B. 103 By Abington and Ehlert. Making an emergency approp. out of the General Rev. Fund of this State for the operation of the Building and Loan Division of the Banking Dept. Ref. to Comm. on Approp. Same as S.B. 46.
- H. B. 104 By Abington and Ehlert. An Act to amend Sec. 8 and 12 of S.B. 111, Chap. 61, P. 100 of the General Laws passed by the 2nd Called Sess. of the 41st Legis. Re: Micro-filming of Building and Loan Association records. Ref. to Comm. on Banks & Banking. Same as S. B. 45.
- H. B. 105 By Abington. An Act to make it the duty of the State Highway Dept. to erect and maintain signs showing the maximum lawful speed for commercial motor vehicles, truck tractors, trailers, and semi-trailers (trucks); and motor vehicles engaged in the business of transporting passengers for compensation or hire (buses). Ref. to Comm. on Highways and Roads. Same as S. B. 19.
- H. B. 106 By Abington. An Act to amend Sec. 17 of Art. I of Art. 666 of the Penal Code (The Texas Liquor Control Act) by adding a new subsec. to be known as Subsec. 15a providing that any bona fide common carrier of persons, engaged in interstate commerce, upon payment of an annual license fee, may be authorized to store and transport in company stores liquor in containers of less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint for sale by such carrier outside of the State of Texas.
