HISTORY & PERSPECTIVE



IN FEBRUARY OF 1978, A GROUP OF individuals concerned with the rights of disabled persons and issues affecting disabled Texans met in Houston to discuss methods of addressing mutual

concerns. During this initial meeting a commitment evolved to establish a statewide coalition of organizations and individuals with disabilities. An interim board of directors was established to draft bylaws and to plan the first delegate assembly.

Disabled leaders from across the state gathered in San Antonio on September 29, 1978 to convene the first delegate assembly of CTD. Proposed bylaws were adopted. A platform listing issues of mutual concern was developed. Priorities and goals of the coalition were set. Officers and board members were elected.

CTD received its charter as non-profit corporation in January 1979. What was previously only a dream became a reality for many Texans with disabilities. With

increased involvement and participation of organizations and individuals active in the disability rights movement, CTD has not only become firmly established but also nationally recognized as an aggressive and moving force within the public and private arena, providing, in 1983, some 30 VISTA volunteers to 22 of its organizational members.

Cross-disability cooperation is both a goal to be achieved and an instrument of tactical value. The Coalition of Texans with Disabilities is a cross-disability coalition concerned with full access to all civil rights for all citizens. It is with great pride that the CTD organizational members from West Texas welcome CTD delegates to El Paso in 1983, on the sixth anniversary of its constitutional birth.

1982-1983 HIGHLIGHTS:

TO BORROW A PHRASE FROM THE 1960's national movement for Civil Rights: "We are better off today than we were yesterday, but we're not as well off as we will be tomorrow."

We can look back with considerable pride and satisfaction at this fifth year of growth and accomplishment of our Coalition of Texans with Disabilities. There are more member organizations with us today than ever before. Our strength in numbers and in influence is ever-increasing.

Our "Disabled But Able to Vote" campaign, launched early 1982, has caught the interest and enthusiasm of other organizations of disabled consumers throughout the country. And, most recently, it was adopted by the American Coalition of Citizens with Disabilities at its May, 1983 Board of Directors meeting to become a national focus of that organization's efforts during this coming year of national elections.

On the state level CTD co-sponsored and co-participated in the celebration of Disability Rally Day...a singularly historic event which generated statewide recognition of disability rights and organizational unity. More than 1500 citizens gathered together at the state capitol last February to lend testimony and credibility to our commitment to improve the quality of life opportunities of all disabled Texans.

Significant progress was also made during the 67th State Legislature The Handicapped Parking Law was strengthened and clarified. Polling site accessibility provisions for disabled citizens were greatly improved. A state sales tax exemption was approved on certain equipment used by visually impaired persons.

A Council on Disability was formally established to advise on the implementing of recommendations set forth by the Governor's Long-Range Planning Committee.

CTD successfully supported a line item in the TRC budget calling for state funding for consumer-directed independent living centers in Texas. In addition, our efforts helped to assure funding for the Texas Commission for the Deaf's Deaf-Blind Pilot Project. And our many letters on behalf of the Southwest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf contributed to the successful appeal by that institution to the Texas legislature for a higher level of funding during the next biennium.

A number of notable appointments of disabled Texans to state boards and com-

missions was also achieved. An unexpected bonus, during the Special Session in late June occurred when the legislature approved the establishment of a Human Rights Commission to protect the civil rights of those minorities most frequently discriminated against. Among the protected classes which were specifically mentioned was "the handicapped."

We did not accomplish all that we set out to accomplish. And yet we are better off today than we were yesterday, but not as well off as we can be tomorrow.

Our Vista Project, to our pleasant surprise, was extended for another full year. This vital network of 30 community volunteers has served CTD well in spreading the word of cross-disability cooperation and communication to all parts of Texas.

In early August CTD went "on line", joining the age of computer technology, when we became the recipients of a generous gift of a T-99 computer from Texas Instruments.

This will be the first year that CTD has held its Delegates Assembly in the western regions of the state. We are deeply proud of and very grateful to the disability advocacy organizations of the host city of El Paso for their invitation as well as for their outstanding efforts during the past year on behalf of the rights of disabled individuals. It is, after all, the awareness and involvement of disabled people at the local level which really counts. The true strength of our organization, the power of our influence, comes from you.

We are the architects of our own future. We can shape the world by our actions and attitudes as individuals and as organizations. We can make a difference in this decade...the decade of **DISABLED CITIZENS.**

It is our decade of choice.

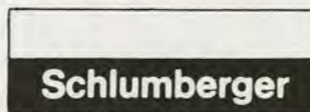

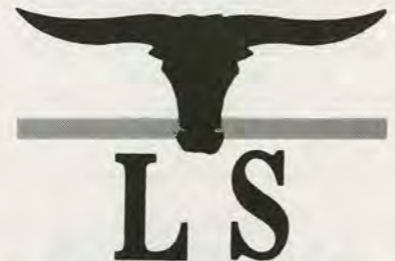

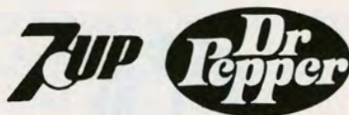

THE CTD/VISTA PROJECT BEGAN in April, 81 with 4 VISTAs and since then has grown to 30 VISTAs. The growth and development of this program has been omnibus, both in terms of increase in number of VISTAs and achievements for CTD.

The VISTA Volunteers serving the local organizations have proven to be a valuable resource to the organization and CTD. VISTA Volunteers have been a key instrument in increasing communication and cooperation among CTD's member organizations. Their hard work and determination has put disabled persons in Texas a step closer to obtaining a more productive and independent life style.

The VISTA program has given disabled persons the opportunity to utilize their many talents and skills to help other

disabled to become more independent and productive. Seventy-five percent (75%) of CTD's 30 VISTA Volunteers are disabled—disabled persons working to benefit disabled persons.

IN 1980 THE HOUSTON CENTER FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING BEGAN serving the disabled community of Houston. In doing so it ushered in a new era of independence for disabled Texans.

Since that first opening, three years ago, four other Independent Living Centers have opened their doors. Now centers in Austin, San Antonio, El Paso and Dallas are able to assist disabled individuals in their cities to become independent, productive, and more fulfilled persons. Because these centers provide services which are not available from any other source, they are filling a void that has existed for years.

Each of these centers from the oldest to the newest have a success story to share. I'm sure that the following successes are just the beginning.

THE HOUSTON CENTER FOR INDEPENDENT living is a service of the Coalition for Barrier-Free Living. The Coalition was organized in 1975 to break down the physical, attitudinal, and legal barriers that have prevented disabled people from being full participants in the life of the community.

HCIL, which opened in 1980, is an integral part of the independent living movement that has grown in the United States during the last decade. Their staff is composed of both disabled and nondisabled people. Their expertise and firsthand knowledge of the problems their clients face qualify them to show the disabled how to overcome the problems of daily living.

They offer personal interviews and assessment of problems and accomplishments and emotional support and guidance. They have qualified disabled counselors to help make decisions in reaching individual independent living goals.

They assist in locating housing, transportation, community resources and job placement.

Their Deaf services include TTY/Voice Exchange, information and referral, interpreter coordination services, and counseling.

A comprehensive data bank is available. They make the appropriate referrals and follow-up with both you and the service to ensure that the assistance requested is obtained.

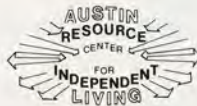
THEY ARE CURRENTLY PROVIDING THE following services: Peer counseling, information and referral, teletype (TTY/TDD) relay service, housing coordination services, travel coordination, social and recreational coordination, sign language interpreting services, braille transcription services, and consciousness raising in the community. THE AUSTIN RESOURCE CENTER FOR INDEPENDENT living, ARCIL, which currently serves approximately 120-150 clients a month, requires only that its clients be willing to take an active role in achieving their goal of greater personal independence.

ARCIL's services include the following: **Job Development**, focusing on job placement, modification of new and existing jobs and job readiness training. **Attendant Referral**, a two way recruitment referral system for attendants and those who utilize them. **Financial/Legal Advocacy**, provides assistance with legal rights, financial resources, self advocacy and systems advocacy. **Information & Referral**, intake assessment and provision of information and availability of local services. **Housing**, provides placement and assessment of housing needs: wheelchair accessible and subsidized housing are areas of special concern. **Peer Counseling**, subjects include adjusting to disability, assertiveness, sexuality and self-image. **Independent Living Skills**, individual training and assessment in skills such as housekeeping, personal care, money management etc.

Their newest program, Herndon House, is a residential transitional living facility in which developmentally disabled adults undergo an intensive six month to one year program designed to increase their independence. This program is the first of its kind in Texas.

THE DALLAS CENTER HAS REPORTED THAT 120 clients have contacted DCIL for specific independent living services. 32 individuals have achieved an independent living goal/goals. Approximately 30 clients are served each month.

EPOCH

EPOCH INVOLVES HANDICAPPED persons in policy-making and management of the program.

The center's major emphasis is on developing independent living skills, but it also coordinates services in many other areas to ensure that clients are able to function more independently in their community. Some of these areas include: Employment, housing, homemaking, legal and financial aid, transportation, architectural barriers.

Each client will have an individualized independent living plan, listing specific goals and services that will be provided by the EPOCH staff.

Their peer counseling program involves both group and individual counseling by disabled persons. Efforts are made to match clients with peer counselors who have specific experience that will benefit the client.

The independent living skills segment of the EPOCH program works closely with a wide range of social service providers, medical and educational institutions to provide maximum access to services for its clients. In addition, the ILS program seeks to expand job opportunities for the disabled through close communications and liaison with agencies and training programs such as WIN, Job Corps and El Paso SER/CETA.

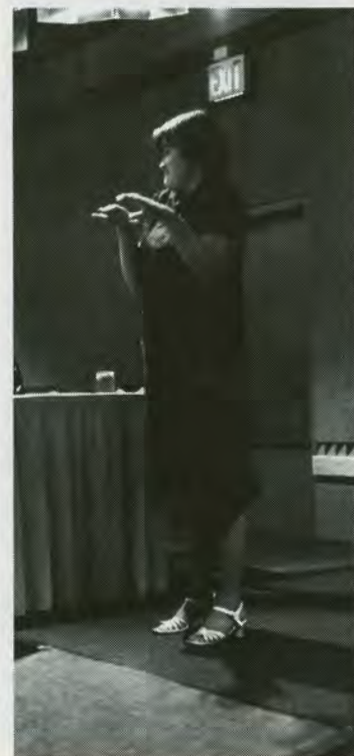

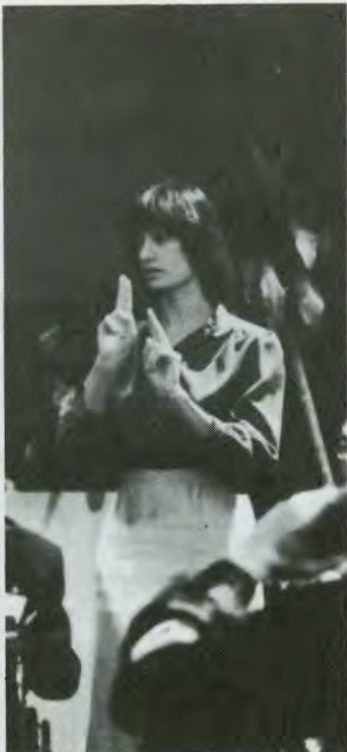
