

About the Barbara Jordan Awards:

Since 1982 the awards have recognized media professionals and others for accurately and progressively portraying Texans with disabilities. The awards are named for former Congresswoman Barbara Jordan, one of Texas' most distinguished citizens and spokespersons for the rights of all people. Award categories include television, print, radio, photojournalism, advertising and special contributions by students, individuals and organizations.

About the Governor's Committee on People with Disabilities:

The Texas Governor's Committee on People with Disabilities consists of 12 members appointed by the governor, seven of whom must be people with disabilities. Four additional ex officio members represent state agencies. The committee promotes compliance with disability laws, recommends policy changes and supports local committees with similar purposes.
