Dart Officials Ixnay Change in Bus Fare

For the second time in two years, DART is backing off from a fare increase for people with disabilities, acknowledging that although service has improved, it hasn't improved enough.

Customers of DART's HandiRides had been objecting strongly to the fare increase whichwas proposed for January 1 and was to be imposed in conjunction with a regulation that would have cut the advance reservation time frame from two weeks to one day.

DART says that due to a high rate of last-minute cancellations, it loses about 17 percent of total hourly fees to the HandiRides contracted service. A proposal to control the cancellation rate and impose a rate increase had been designed to help defray the large subsidy which covers the cost of the rides. HandiRides cost \$31 more than the fare, as compared to \$2.60 more than the fare for regular bus service.

Winter Party to Honor Attendants




It's here again! HRA has organized a winter party to thank all the dedicated souls who unselfishly assist HRA clients every day.



Six years after a crippling spinal cord injury, soul legend Curtis Mayfield returns with a new CD

Curtis Mayfield says he has "phantom hands" that seem to move while his own lie immobile. In his gracious Atlanta home, he speaks in the sweetly penetrating voice of his soul classics, but softer now, trailing away at the ends of sentences. The phantom hands, he says, sometimes worry at the keys of a piano: sometimes they hurt. They are a mystery to him, as is much about his body. "I feel like when I got hit, it knocked everything out of whack," he says. "Now everything is somewhere else. Sometimes it feels that if someone whacked me good another time, it'd knock them all back in place." For Mayfield, this is a good day. His blood pressure is strong so he can sit upright in his wheelchair. He smiles as he calls to his assistant, "Put on our number one record."

In 1990 Mayfield was tuning his guitar on a Brooklyn stage when a lighting tower blew down on him, leaving him paralyzed from the neck down. He did not figure to ever make music again. But last week he released "New World Order," an incisive collection of new songs that - good news sounds like Curtis Mayfield. The title track plays in Spike Lee's new movie, "Get on the Bus." He recorded the music prone, singing a few lines at a time until his breath gave out. From the stereo, the song sneaks up, a hint of funky guitar and Mayfield's coolly passionate voice: "Darkness no longer," he sings, "a child is born." If it is not a number one hit, it is, just by its exis tence, a triumph. "It's nice to say, I'm back to living again," says Mayfield.

When asked for the stories behind classics like "People Get Ready" or "Superfly," Mayfield answers by reading lyrics. This is surprisingly edifying; even softly spoken, his words are powerful with narrative and rhythm. "My mother always read me lots of poems," he explains. "Paul Laurence

Dunbar, I loved Dr. Seuss, limericks. These became the foundations for my hook lines and rhythmic patterns." He recites a lyric from "Keep on Pushing" from 1964: "God gave me strength/And it don't make sense/Not to keep on pushing."

Back then, this song became an anthem for the civil rights movement. In his quiet study, it still declares an unshakable pride and determination. Curtis Mayfield keeps on pushing.

Meet Justin Carroll


Welcome to one of our newest members of the Board of Directors. In his mid twenties, Justin Carroll also happens to be the youngest.
