Dycus Recounts Heroes of HRA

"I always thought HRA's story sold itself," said John Dycus modestly during his address to 250 guests at Celebration HRA!

Although John himself was the honored guest, his words, true to form, kept the emphasis himself and focused it on a chronology of people who have made HRA what it is today.

"Lately I have heard myself described as a hero," John said. "If you want to talk about heroes, I offer you the name of Sam Provence," referring to HRA's late founder, whose charisma still

lingers in the organization.

John went on to list other names: Jim Hayes, who traveled from Austin to Arlington, pushing his own wheelchair, in less than a day; Gene Brown, the Personal Attendant, who cares for clients on a daily basis; Skip Lefler of Arlington National Bank, who helped HRA obtain a loan which kept if afloat during a particularly bad year; Sam Cole, Bobbie Heckathorn, and a list of others.

'May you never need HRA," said John. "But how grateful I am to Sam Provence and his family who did what they did to make

sure HRA sticks around, in case you ever do."

Virtual Classes Becoming Reality

First, there were classes broadcast on public television. Then came computer network-based course work. Now, 'virtual' college is the next generation of long-distance learning.

Virtual colleges have no physical campus or fulltime professors. They borrow faculty members from other institutions and enroll students without regard to geographic boundaries or available classroom space. Virtual colleges challenge traditional universities' geographic ties, their grading and credit systems and educational goals.

Most Americans have paid little attention to this burgeoning form of higher education. Nevertheless, options for students have multiplied:

•The University of Phoenix, with outposts around the U.S., has offered on-line graduate services since 1989.

•The Dallas County College District allows students to earn an associate of arts and sciences degree via distance learning. Students must register through an existing campus.

•The Colorado Electronic Community College is

seeking accreditation to grant its own degrees.

The most ambitious new electronic college is Western Governors University. The university, incorporated in January, will operate as an independent, nonprofit school with faculty drawn from business and other educational institutions.

Students won't receive grades or credit hours. Instead, the will be required to pass competency tests to show they have mastered the skills needed for a degree or certificate. Business leaders will strongly influence the school's curriculum and also provide non-degree corporate training.

Western Governors University's narrow focus makes it feel more like a vocational-technical center than a true university - which means it probably won't compete with liberal arts colleges for traditional students. Its administrators will have to struggle to balance student and public interests against those of the businesses that will help shape its curriculum.

Since more than a third of students enrolled in college courses today are not the traditional 18 to 22-year-old, Western Governors has tried to fill a gap in traditional higher education systems and encourage educational innovation.

If you're interested in participating in a "virtual class" locally, The Dallas County Community College District's LeCroy Center for Educational Technology produces broadcast-quality video courses, on-line courses and classes on one-way video with live call-in. This fall, it is offering 57 distance courses. More than 100,000 students enroll in these telecourses every year, making the LeCroy Center one of the most respected in its field.
