Our office has checked with several different areas concerning parking problems which might be encountered by handicapped students. It is our understanding that the size of the handicapped parking has been enlarged so that these students can have better accessibility to and from their vehicles. In addition, various University representatives are maintaining close relations with the Handicapped Students Association concerning problems which they might encounter. In conferring with Chief Megason, we find that he has not received any complaints regarding parking difficulties encountered by handicapped students.

We will certainly continue to monitor handicapped parking and if there are problems which need correction, we will make every effort to make the necessary changes.
