The Pier

In keeping with the mission to construct public works, a wheelchair accessible fishing pier is contemplated on the hike and bike trail of Austin's Lady Bird Lake.


Based on the plans of a similar fishing pier in Nacogdoches, the pier will allow every angler to take advantage of the unique fishing opportunities of this urban lake, without the need for a boat. The pier will be mixed use and includes a section of dock so boats can be launched, specifically the long "dragon" boats used by the Asian-American Council in Austin. The partially covered, lighted pier will be located along the Lady Bird Lake Hike and Bike Trail near Capital Metro routes and accessible parking. Construction will cost approximately \$80,000.00 to \$100,000.00.

Austin is a special place to live and play, the Foundation seeks more inclusiveness for citizens with mobility impairments. We anticipate that this new downtown amenity will surely become another jewel in the Austin Parks system.

Why Lady Bird Lake?

- Urban Lake known for its beauty
- Popular with anglers for the diversity of its fish variety
- •Will add another amenity closer to I-35 on the north side of the river for fishing, bat watching, and boat launching
- Close to accessible parking and bus lines
- Out of more traveled rowing and canoing lanes





General Notes

- Project will be constructed through corporate and community donations
- Money will be reserved to assist Austin Parks and Recreation (PARD) to maintain the pier
- Austin PARD have provided assistance on regulations and construction materials
- Holiday Inn management has expressed strong desire to support the project
- Pier requires no request for variance
- •Amber bait fish lighting below the pier and coin-operated duck feeders will attract fish
- •Dragon boat training is a year-round activity for the Asian-American Council
