Here We Grow Again!

Did you know that HRA now provides services and support to over 250 people (both adults and children) throughout the state of Texas, and that we currently provide those services through four different programs? Well, we do!

The newest program that HRA has developed is called Primary Home Care. The Primary Home Care (PHC) Program is actually three new programs all in one, including:

- Community Attendant Care provides an in-home attendant for adults with a medical need for specific tasks.
- Primary Home Care (PHC) is a nontechnical, medically related personal care service prescribed by a physician as part of a client's plan of care. PHC is available to eligible adults and children whose health problems cause them to be functionally limited in performing activities of daily living. PHC services are provided by an attendant and may require the supervision of a registered nurse.
- Family Care is a non-skilled, non-technical service provided to eligible adults who are functionally limited in performing daily activities.

All of these programs are provided through a contract with the Texas Department of Human Services, allowing HRA to reach out to more people with more diverse needs throughout our community. We want to be able to reduce the numbers of people waiting for services and provide quality care to as many people as possible - so stay tuned as we continue to grow again soon! Transfer Board, Swivel Seat, Spinner Knob, Panoramic Mirror, Hand Controls, Accessible Bus Service, and the Additional Driver Fee Waiver.

Avis Access is a component of Avis' long-standing Avis Cares[®] program. The new services will be introduced in the top 100 markets, in flights of 20 cities at a time, by year-end. All the products for Avis Access were developed in conjunction with Diversity Partners, a company that relies on people with disabilities to design and produce goods and services.

My name is Lance Strong. I'm 56 years old and I have been a quadriplegic since I was 16 — a diving accident occurred which resulted in this condition.

I was in the hospital for two years before coming home to be with my family. Ever since then, we have had many problems trying to find health caregivers and financial support.
