Dear Mr. Smith:

Brandon talked to me about Shirley Sue, and I do not recall the exact manner I presented it to you several years ago. The facts are that we occasionally see congenital deformities in two or three children of a family. While this is unusual, there are many, many cases of one child having some congenital defect and others perfectly normal. It, therefore, becomes necessary to consider it, and yet in your circumstances, with the deformity limited to a failure of full rotation of the shoulder in embryonic life, I would consider it a purely local defect and would not have any particular fear of other deformities.
